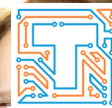




# Google Educator Programme

turn IT on Google Educator Programme (Level 1)





## Overview

The **turn IT on** Google Educator Programme will commence in autumn 2022 of the new 2022-2023 academic year. It follows a successful year during 2021-2022 where **turn IT on** have worked with staff who joined us for Google events or webinars to support their professional development. The Google Educator programme is designed to help teachers who are passionate about teaching learn to get the most from technology that exists in their schools. It is about making excellent use of the myriad of Google Workspace education tools available with the aim to positively impact on pupil progress and support reduction of teacher workloads. Technology will not have an impact in school without vision planning and holistic engagement from staff. To ensure any new technology achieves its full potential there must be a driving force 'digital leader' at the school. The Google Educator programme is about helping teachers to become the catalyst for change. **Turn IT on** want to help teachers become inspired to then inspire their pupils, but as importantly as the rest of the staff in their school. Ultimately the programme should result in you being in a strong position to complete the Google Educator assessment to become a qualified Google Educator Level 1, something that we believe will look good on a CV and may also lead to you wanting to put your school forward to become a Google Education reference school. **Turn IT on** will run the programme free of charge without any additional costs to schools. The sessions support staff in their Google Educator Level 1 assessment preparation and gain a wider understanding of how Google Workspace for Education can have a positive impact on organisation, communication and collaboration.

## Content

The Google Educator Level 1 (GE L1) programme consists of a series of seven online meetings/training sessions which will run over the course of four months. Meetings will be delivered by members of the **turn IT on** digital transformation team lead by our own Google Educators. Each meeting will focus on a different aspect of the Google Workspace for Education suite, Google Classroom as well as specific accessibility tools contained within the products. These meetings will be supplemented by two Q & A online sessions with existing Google Educators as well an opportunity to connect with an event link to a Google Education reference school. Details of each Google Educator session will be made available at the programme launch.

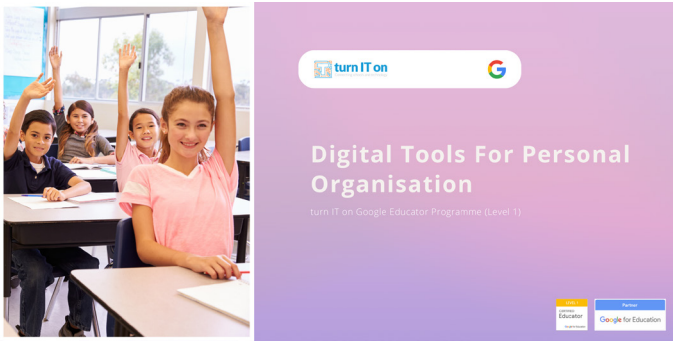
## Developing a 21st Century Learning Environment

This session focuses on getting prepared for integrating technology into teaching and learning using a range of Google Workspace apps.



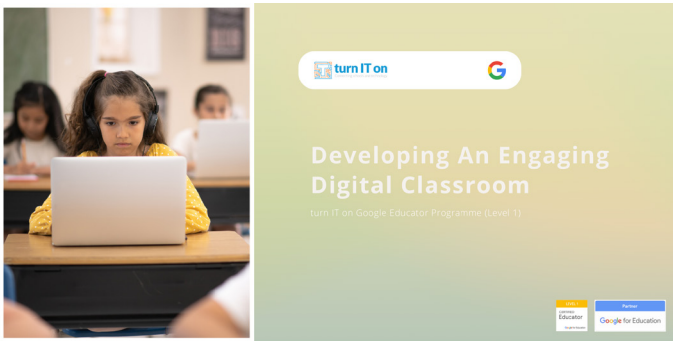
## Creating a Digital Learning Environment

Developing a learning environment to support storage of resources, collaboration and communication (Google Drive, Classroom, Meet, Docs, Sheets, Slides, Forms, Sites and Drawings). This session focuses on getting prepared for integrating technology into an online classroom using a range of Google Workspace apps.



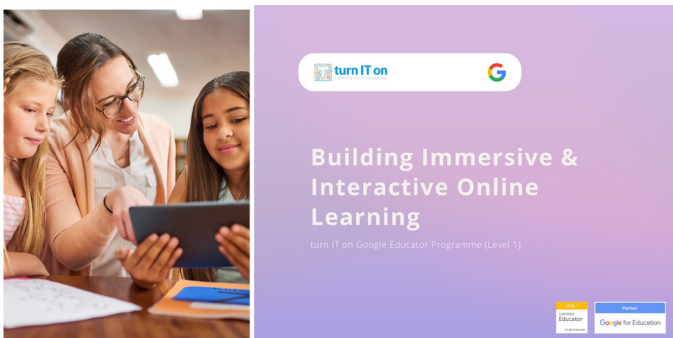
## Digital Tools For Personal Organisation

How to make the most of digital tools to efficiently manage personal appointments and meetings (Google Calendar, Keep, Meet and Drive). This session focuses on adopting an online calendar for personal organisation and efficiency of online meetings.



## Developing an Engaging Digital Classroom

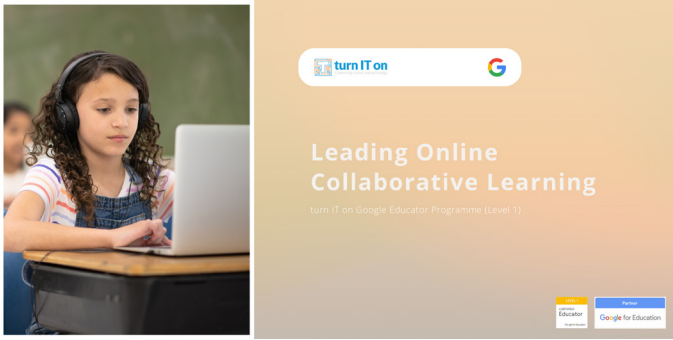
How to create an engaging online classroom for students and measure their progress (Google Classroom). This session focuses on adopting a virtual classroom and using a range of Google Workspace apps.



## Building Interactive Online Lessons

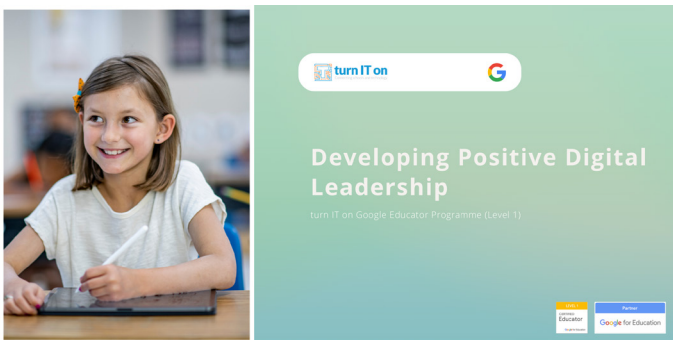
Create engaging learning resources to share with students in Google Classroom (Google Slides, Earth and Chrome). This session focuses on getting prepared for integrating technology into creating engaging online lessons using a range of Google Workspace apps.





## Leading Online Collaborative Learning

Develop the use of online tools and media to support learning inside and outside the classroom (Google Classroom, YouTube) This session focuses on getting prepared for integrating technology into teaching and learning using a range of Google Workspace apps.



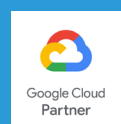
## Developing Positive Digital Leadership

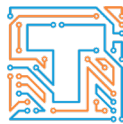
Developing student online skills to become a responsible digital citizen (Google Chrome). This session focuses on getting prepared for students being prepared for the wider digital world.

Participants joining the Google Educator Level 1 programme are encouraged to:

- Be brave and try to implement some of the things we discuss in the meetings in your schools.
- Collaborate, share and support one another via the shared online GE L1 community space (Google Classroom) that we curate to act as the hub for the course.
- Complete an exam assessment\* to be a Google Educator Level 1 and submit it to Google. (\* Google Educator Level one assessment will cost £10 which is payable by the school and not covered by turn IT on through the provision of the free course)





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
